## MINUTES OF EAST PENNARD PARISH COUNCIL MEETING Held in the Village Hall on Thursday, 19<sup>th</sup> May 2022 at 8.00pm

The Chairman welcomed everyone to the first Parish Council meeting of the new term.		
1. Apologies	Paul Heal, Martin Llewellyn	
2. Minutes of Last Meeting:	The minutes of the meeting on 10 <sup>th</sup> March 2022 were approved as being a true record on the proposition of Martin Dearden and seconded by Roger Cock. They were then signed by the Chairman.	
3. Matters Arising	<ul> <li>Shooting Ground Noise: The problem is ongoing and no progress made.</li> <li>Paul Heal wrote that the new case officer needs to be contacted as a reminder to arrange to install monitoring equipment at 2 farms in East Pennard. Pilton Parish Council has now taken this matter up.</li> <li>Defibrillator: No progress made. Some discussion about the problem of there not being a mobile phone signal at the Village Hall, which is the most central site.</li> <li>Jubilee Celebrations: Plans going ahead.</li> <li>Parish Footpaths: It was agreed that Kerry Dodd, the new Parish Path Liaison Officer (PPLO) is to be invited to a council meeting.</li> </ul>	
4. Financial Report	Payments for Insurance, SALC Affiliation fee, Hall hire and the Internal Audit fee were agreed. Extra cheques were signed to cover these payments.	
5. Planning Applications	<ul> <li>i) Land at Coombe Farm, Parbrook 2022/0479/FUL</li> <li><i>Erection of agricultural building for storage of fodder and machinery</i></li> <li>The applicant and an objector both spoke about this application, which is in West Bradley parish.</li> <li>Decision: Leave to the Planning Officer. Concerns about road access, which is in the parish of East Pennard, were noted and discussed. The applicant stated that he is making improvements.</li> <li>ii) Travellers Rest, Fosse Way 2022/0584/FUL</li> <li><i>Change of use and conversion of public house, manager's flat and guest rooms to 2 dwellings with associated parking</i></li> <li>Decision: Recommend Approval. It is an appropriate use for the building and has plenty of room for off-road parking in this capacity. Whilst recommending approval the council regrets the closing of another licensed premises.</li> <li>iii) The Lodge, Little Pennard 2022/0669/FUL</li> </ul>	

	Demolition of outbuildings to be replaced by erection of single outbuilding, erection of a gate to existing access and associated works <b>Decision:</b> Recommend Approval. The shed is a great improvement on what is there. There is some concern about the effect of planting a hedge on the visibility splay at the access from the Ditcheat road onto the A37.
6. Broadband Provision	Progress is being made in the village.
7. Village Hall	Both the interior and the exterior works have now been done. A donation request had been made from the Council of £500 for the Hall. Roger Cock proposed, and Martin Dearden seconded, this proposal. A coffee morning is to be held in July.
8. Correspondence	A letter had been received from Clive Millington with the suggestion of planting a tree on the Triangle to commemorate the jubilee. Clive Millington and Roger Cock were willing to do the necessary work. After some discussion Adrian Pearse proposed, and Martin Dearden seconded a donation of £100 towards this project. Martin Dearden suggested a Queen's Jubilee plaque.
9. Date of Next Meeting	The next Parish Council meeting will be held at 7.30pm on Thursday, 21 <sup>st</sup> July 2022.
